



# The 2010 Tilde University Press ANZAM Early Career Researcher Award

## 1. Introduction

- 1.1 The purpose of this document is to provide some basic information about the Tilde University Press ANZAM Early Career Researcher (ECR) Award and to outline the process and criteria for nomination and selection. This Award is sponsored by the Tilde University Press.

## 2. The Tilde University Press ANZAM Early Career Researcher Award

- 2.1 The purpose of the Early Career Researcher (ECR) award is to foster and recognise the research and scholarly achievements of emerging researchers who are at an early stage in an academic career.
- 2.2 The ECR Award consists of a plaque and a cheque for A\$2,000.
- 2.3 The winner of the Award is chosen by a selection panel comprising at least 3 members of the Research and Research Development Sub-committee of the ANZAM Executive.
- 2.4 The winner of the Award is normally announced at an award ceremony at the annual ANZAM Conference.

## 3. Eligibility for the ECR Award

- 3.1 Early Career Researchers are defined as current ANZAM members who have been awarded a doctoral degree (or equivalent) within the last 5 years.
- 3.2 Nominees must have an appointment at no higher than Level C (Australia) and Senior Lecturer (New Zealand), if employed by a university (or equivalent).
- 3.3 Nominees are expected to have been paid up personal (i.e., not Institutional) members of ANZAM for at least two years (note, this can include the year of submission) in the last 5 years.
- 3.4 Nominees must be willing to attend and present a paper or lead a symposium on their research at the full ANZAM conference in the year following their nomination.

## 4. Criteria for the ECR Award

- 4.1 In assessing the strength of ECR award nominations, the selection panel will pay particular attention to the quality, standing and impact of the nominee's research outputs, as well as the outlets in which these are published. In addition, attention will be paid to the originality, contemporary significance, conceptual, methodological and theoretical soundness of their work, and the nominee's developing platform of research.

## **5. The Nomination Process**

- 5.1 Eligible ANZAM members who wish to be nominated for this Award should submit **4 copies of:**
- completed nomination form;
  - a curriculum vitae (no more than 4 pages). Identify with an asterisk up to four of the nominee's best research outputs. Work that is accepted for publication can be included;
  - a statement on their level of contribution to any co-authored work that appears in the list of the nominee's top four research outputs.
  - a one-page statement that outlines their research achievements, including grants and awards, and which identifies the strand or strands of research inquiry to which the nominated research outputs contribute;
  - Names of from two to four referees who can comment on the quality of the nominee's research.
