CONFERENCE LOCATION AND VENUE

The Adelaide Convention Centre is located on the Torrens River in Adelaide the capital of South Australia. Adelaide is surrounded on the east by the scenic Mt Lofty Ranges and on the west by Gulf St Vincent. It is regarded as Australia's festival and event capital – and prides itself on its live music, art scene and cultural events. Adelaide was founded by colonised free settlers around the mid 1830's, in the area originally inhabited by indigenous Australians of the Kurna tribe. Designed by Colonel William Light, Adelaide is a planned city and is set out in a grid layout, interspaced by wide boulevards and large public squares, and entirely surrounded by parkland. Adelaide is also famous for its historic building heritage and is home to the world famous, Adelaide Oval - widely regarded as the most picturesque test cricket ground in the world and venue of the Ashes test just before the conference.

And if that isn't temptation enough - Adelaide is in central location to one of Australia's best known wine growing regions, the Barossa valley!

KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



Sara Rynes-Weller is the John F. Murray Professor of Management and Organizations at Tippie College of Business, University of Iowa. She is a leading authority in Organisation and Management studies and was the editor of the Academy of Management Journal from 2005-2007. She has published a number of papers in the Academy of Management Journal, Journal of Applied Psychology, Organization Studies, and Human Resource Management of which she is a current editorial board member. Her research interests are in academic-practitioner relationships, compensation, management education, and human resource strategies.



Professor Sri Zaheer holds the Elmer L. Andersen Chair in Global Corporate Social Responsibility at the Carlson School of Management, University of Minnesota, where she also serves as Associate Dean of Faculty and Research. She is a Fellow of the Academy of International Business, and Reviewing Editor of the Journal of International Business Studies. Professor Zaheer has published extensively in journals such as the Academy of Management Review, Academy of Management Journal, Management Science, Strategic Management Journal and Journal of International Business Studies. Her current research interests centre on international strategy and organization.
