Kerry Brown is the Mulpha Chair in Tourism Asset Management and Professor in the School of Tourism and Hospitality Management, Southern Cross University. Her previous role was Professor in the School of Management at Queensland University of Technology and Program Leader for the Cooperative Research Centre for Integrated Engineering Asset Management (CIEAM) Strategic Human Dimensions Program. She is the interim Program Leader for the Organisational Performance and Human Capability Program for CIEAM2.

Her principal research areas are change management; collaboration, networks and clusters; capability, strategy, management and policy for infrastructure and asset management; work-life balance, gender and careers in the public sector, public sector management and policy, government-community relations and employment relations.

She has co-authored two books, one examining the interrelationships between government, business and society and the other on managing change and innovation in the public sector. Kerry has also co-edited 3 books on innovation in the construction industry and published over 50 articles in scholarly journals. She is an editorial board member of the *International Journal of Small Business and Globalization* and the *Journal of Organizational Change Management* and, Queensland editor of *Public Administration To-day*. Active in industry-sponsored research, she has been awarded eight Australian Research Council (ARC) grants (including one ARC Linkage Grant on Australian Workplaces in the November 2008 round) and many commercial research grants particularly in the area of organisational development and strategy, public policy and evaluation.

Professor Brown is a member of the Queensland Department of Main Roads Governance Board; Executive Board Member of the *International Society for Public Management* and, Executive Board Member and Founding Fellow of the *International Society for Engineering Asset Management*. She was recently awarded an Australia and New Zealand Academy of Management (ANZAM) Research Fellow (2009-2011).
