Ralph's research and teaching focus on inquiry in organization studies. Ralph supervises postgraduate and doctoral student research. He takes an active role in developing the School's research capacity and in supporting individual staff member's research.

Ralph is co-editor of the Advances in Organization Studies book series published by Liber/ Copenhagen Business School. He currently serves on the editorial board of Academy of Management Learning and Education. Asia Pacific Journal of Human Resources, Journal of Organizational Change Management, Management Communication Quarterly, and Organization Management Journal. Ralph is a chair emeritus of the Critical Management Studies Interest Group of the Academy of Management.

Ralph's publications include contributions on epistemology, two edited volumes with Peter Frost entitled Renewing Research Practice and Doing Exemplary Research, and the chapter on data in the Handbook of Organization Studies.
