The 15th ANZAM Operations, Supply Chain and Services Management (OSCSM) Symposium will focus at the value adding role of operations and supply chain for the society – globally as well as for the ANZAM region. We seek contributions from academics and practitioners on the issues in the operations, supply chain, and services management discipline and especially on the themes below as well as other:

- OSCSM and value adding: who/what determines value, how is value created, communicated, captured and delivered in supply chains? How does OSCSM operationalise the concept of value? How is value measured?
- Societal understating of OSCSM as a discipline: how general public views OSCSM and its role within/contribution for national economies? How can we enhance general public's awareness about the importance of OSCSM?

- OSCSM and sustainability: how can OSCSM add value to the pursuit of sustainability? What is the impact of OSCSM practices on global sustainability? What is the role/impact of voluntary certifications on sustainability? Can supply chains effectively regulate themselves to achieve sustainability?
- OSCSM and circular economy: what is the role of OSCSM in the circular economy? What supply chain designs/ models can enhance the concept of product take back? Who and how should govern the principles of circular economy in general and specifically for in terms of supply chain management?
- OSCSM and innovation: what skills and competence in OSCSM are critical for innovation and New Product Development?

Call for Papers

We invite contributions addressing the topics above as well as other issues in the operations, supply chain, and services management discipline. These contributions should aim to take the discipline forward and can be of any type, including conceptual papers, empirical studies, analytical modelling, and simulation. Details about the requirements for extended abstracts and full papers will be available on a website.

The ANZAM Operations, Supply Chain, and Services Management Symposium series has provided the platform for academics and practitioners to share their research, knowledge, and practical experiences in operations, supply chain, and service management. These symposia have contributed greatly to building knowledge of the discipline and enhancing the partnership between research and practice. The 2017 ANZAM Symposium continues this tradition of sharing research and ideas in the discipline, as well as welcome's contributions from professionals on current issues and best practice. In particular, the symposium plans an industry-focused track for the second day, and encourages discussion between researchers and professionals working in similar areas
