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# FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK



**Dear Colleagues** 

I am writing this in Melbourne, just before leaving for Brisbane for the first ANZAM Executive meeting and the ANZAM Institutional Members meeting to be held on 26 and 27 March 2009. I would like to start with a number of thanks. First, thanks to University of Technology, Sydney and Peggy Hui. As you will all know, UTS hosted the ANZAM Secretariat for six years and provided considerable support for its smooth running. In this respect, I would like to thank the UTS School of Management and the Faculty of Business, and especially Ian Palmer for his ongoing support. Many of you will also know that Ian has now moved to RMIT University. Peggy Hui was the backbone of ANZAM for well over ten years as Secretariat Coordinator. All Executive members relied heavily on her experience and knowledge of a whole range of issues. Thank you again Peggy, and we all wish you the very best for the future.

My second thanks are for Griffith University, Faculty of Business, and especially for Professor Michael Powell (Pro Vice-Chancellor) for hosting the ANZAM Secretariat at the Gold Coast Campus. Professor Liz Fulop from the Griffith School of Management has been very helpful in the transition and my thanks are extended to her also. Many of you will have already received some communication from Anne Anderson, the new ANZAM Secretariat Co-ordinator. Welcome, Anne. I am sure that ANZAM will provide a challenging and exciting work environment, and we look forward to working with you.

The past three months have certainly been challenging for many of us. The transfer of the Secretariat from UTS to Griffith University in early January was a considerable amount of work for both Peggy Hui and Anne Anderson. Liz Fulop's involvement and support was absolutely essential over this period.

Anne is now well prepared to take on a variety of tasks, including being the webmaster for the ANZAM website. The transfer of the ANZAM website and the Conference website from Waikato University in New Zealand to Griffith University was also challenging in many respects. I would like to thank Professor Delwyn Clark for hosting the websites at Waikato University for the past three years and thanks to the Griffith University IS staff for undertaking the necessary development work for the websites.

The next couple of years will present many challenges and opportunities for management academics. The recent change in the federal government and its subsequent replacement of the RQF with ERA will have a number of implications. The continuing global economic crisis has been the talking point in many quarters, including Management Department/School Executive meetings and Business Faculty Executive meetings around Australia and New Zealand. A question often asked by many is how the economic crisis will impact on Business Schools. This is the theme of the first ANZAM Institutional Members meeting being held in Brisbane on 27 March 2009. In the longer term, as a number of Asian countries develop their own capacity in higher education, Australian and New Zealand institutions will see a significant reduction in international students. For example, the Indian Government recently announced the establishment of seven new Institutes of Management, eight new Institutes of Technology, and ten new National Institutes of Technology. It will also provide support to the states for the establishment of one thousand new Polytechnics.

For ANZAM, 2009 will be an exciting year. For the first time in our history, the ANZAM Annual Conference will be held in conjunction with the ANZMAC Annual Conference in Melbourne (ANZMAC: 30 November-2 December and ANZAM: 2 December-4 December). The theme for the two Conferences is "Sustainable Management and Marketing". Professor Tim Flannery (a leading Environmentalist and the 2007 Australian of the Year) will be the keynote speaker on Wednesday 2 December, which is a combined day for the two Conferences. Professor Dexter Dumphy will be the second keynote speaker. We look forward to seeing you in Melbourne during the first week of December 2009. I should add that the 2008 annual ANZAM Conference hosted by the University of Auckland in their new Business School building was highly successful on all counts. Professor Marie Wilson did a fantastic job as the Conference Chair. Thank you very much Marie for all your hard work.

We have planned for a Mid-Year Doctoral Workshop to be held in Adelaide at the University of South Australia campus (10-11 June 2009). UniSA will also be hosting the 7<sup>th</sup> ANZAM Operations Management Symposium (9-10 June 2009). The annual Doctoral Workshop will be held in conjunction with our Annual Conference in Melbourne and is being hosted by Victoria University.

In closing, I hope that you have made a good start to the 2009 academic year and I wish you the very best in all your endeavours.

## JMO UPDATE

JMO enjoyed a bumper year in 2008. The number of submissions grew from 90 in 2007 to over 175 in 2008, with projections of between 200-250 submissions in 2009. We receive contributions from all over the world, including the US, UK, Europe, Middle East, Taiwan, India and Canada. Whilst we see a lot of papers in the HRM and OB areas and an increasing number in the management education area, we would like to receive more submissions in areas such as strategy, entrepreneurship, practitioner perspectives and methodology. Our special issues are proving quite popular and will now be bundled for sale to libraries under a separate ISBN number (whilst retaining complete JMO citation details). Special issues in the pipeline including Family Business, Corporate Governance, Profitable Margins, Sports Management, Stability and Change, and Sustainability.

In 2009, JMO will be moving to an online peer review management process which should see improvements in review turn-around times. Our current rejection rate is around 70% and we are looking to push this higher as we work to move JMO to an even higher quality level. JMO is now listed in SSCI and we are looking to increase the visibility and usage of the research, teaching, practical and methodological developments through enhancing how often JMO articles are cited. **To help increase this visibility as well as to better build on the platforms established by those who publish in JMO, I'd like to strongly encourage ANZAM researchers to consider citing, wherever relevant to your purposes, work published in JMO**. This will help us to enhance the stature of JMO in the world stage, an important endeavour in the world of research assessment exercises like PBRF in New Zealand and the upcoming ERA exercise in Australia.


### **NEW ACADEMIC PROGRAM**
