ANZAM-2017-170	Professional Identity: Friend or Foe to Integrated Care	<p>Integrated care has been identified as essential to delivering the reforms required in health and social care and is a priority across the UK. Recommendations in terms of what form this takes is somewhat scarce. Much is known about the drivers that construct professional identity such as gender and profession, but little is known about practitioners' perceptions of the value of professional identity while working in an integrated team. This qualitative study examines health and social care practitioners' perceptions of PI and the factors that influence PI when working in integrated teams. Focus group participants describe PI as the scope of practice, trust and uniqueness to the team.
