### 2018 RESEARCH NOTE GUIDELINES

---

If you wish to present your work at a Roundtable Workshop you must include a short research note with this application. Your research note should be a separate document, **3-5 pages in length** excluding references, and must follow **APA 6<sup>th</sup> edition formatting**. Please email your submission to the **ANZAM Academy Manager** ([anzam@anzam.org](mailto:anzam@anzam.org)), along with your completed Registration Form, by **1 October 2018**. Your research note will be circulated to both the students and academics in advance of the Roundtable Workshop.

Your research note should explain your doctoral research in a clear and succinct manner – remember, not everyone at your table will know your specific area. The following guidelines may help you to structure your research note. You will also find a pre-formatted template document on the following three pages which you should use for your submission.

| <b>Title</b>                   | Include the working title of your thesis/dissertation  |
| <b>Keyword</b>                 | Include at least four keywords to describe your research. This will assist us in matching you with a relevant session. At least one keyword should be a research method. |
| <b>Introduction</b>            | Outline the phenomenon that you are investigating and state why it is important; capture the reader's interest   |
| <b>Research Questions</b>      | Clearly state your research question(s)  |
| <b>Theory Development</b>      | Briefly review the 2-3 main constructs underpinning your research and then explain how your new theory or approach fits into the current literature                      |
| <b>Method</b>                  | Summarise how you intend to explore this phenomenon; depending on your progress, this may have more or less detail of what you will do or have done                      |
| <b>Results/<br/>Discussion</b> | You can report your findings here if you have already completed some data collection and analysis, but this is not required  |
