FACILITATORS



Mark Saunders is Professor of Business Research Methods in the Department of Management at the University of Birmingham, UK. His research interests include research methods in particular participants selection, methods for understanding organizational relationships; human resource aspects of the management of change, in particular trust within and between organizations and organizational learning. Mark has co-authored and edited a range of books including *Research Methods for Business Students* (currently in its seventh edition), *How to keep your research project on track: Insights from when things go wrong*, *Doing Research in Business and Management* (currently in its second edition), *Conducting Case Studies for Business and Management*, *Organizational Trust: a Cultural Perspective*, *Handbook of Research Methods on Trust* (currently in its second edition) and *Handbook of Research Methods on Human Resource Development*.



Ros Cameron is Professor and Director of the Centre for Organisational Change and Agility (COCA) at Torrens University Australia, Adelaide, SA. Ros is a founding Convenor of the Mixed Methods Research Special Interest Group of ANZAM and an Executive Board Member of the Mixed Methods International Research Assoc (MMIRA). She utilizes mixed methods in many of her funded research projects and publishes in the use of mixed methods across business and management disciplines. She has been granted \$1.3 (AUD) million in research funding and has over 90 publications.



Anneke completed her PhD in Commerce in 2003. Since then she has mainly focussed on organisational behaviour and leadership in change management as well as closing the research to practice gap through research translation, implementation and sustainability in healthcare contexts. She is currently a research Professor of Health Management at Griffith University, has completed 17 Higher Degree by research Students, over 140 peer reviewed publications and a little more than \$27 mil external income, leading large competitive grants using mixed methods.
