

TUA PhD Tuition Scholarships

Overview

A number of TUA Tuition Scholarships are currently available for permanent resident student tuition fees for Trimester 3 2020.

The tuition scholarship is only for Targeted projects and must be aligned to a TUA centre priority projects.

These projects are in the following areas:

COCA Project: AI and data applications for Organisational Agility

Examine key organisational issues related to advances in technologies and their impacts on organisational sustainability, agility, ethical and evidence-based decision making and leadership in the era of the Fourth Industrial Revolution (4IR).

Student Profile: background in a business and/or management discipline and interest in how AI and data analytics is impacting organisations (in any industry sector) and leadership/decision making/business ethics

COCA Project: Employability and Future Skilling

Investigate the impacts of disruptive technologies on professional education and training, future skilling, and employability

Student Profile: interest in aspects of future skilling in areas such as: VET or Higher Education; workplace training; youth/graduate employability (any professional field)

COCA Cluster Project: Emerging Soft Skills for Hospitality Customer Experiences

To analyse challenges, opportunities and emerging issues associated with employee soft skills needed to deliver superior customer experiences for the future of hospitality service.

Student Profile: background in hospitality operations or leadership with an interest in customer experience design and management (Hospitality discipline), and a desire to pursue hospitality education, workplace training and/or professional development.

Eligibility

These are only for domestic PhD students and students must be eligible for entry. The student must have a bachelor's degree with first-class or upper second-class honours, or a research master's degree from a recognised university with a minimum credit result. Desired but not mandatory are publications, conference and keynote presentations, previous grants and industry research experience. This will be a competitive process.

How to apply

Applicants are strongly encouraged to contact the relevant Centre Directors or a prospective supervisor and are not able to lodge an application with out support from the centres. It is strongly advised you make contact and discuss the proposed research topic and related matters.

Scholarships are awarded based on academic merit, and applicants should provide supporting evidence in the form of transcripts, awards, copy of examined thesis, research publications etc.

Applicants will be assessed on the following (but not limited to):

- research capacity and experience
- student's potential to complete the HDR course
- undertaking research in line with the University's Research Strategic Plan

Other considerations will include:

- other HDR courses completed at an equivalent or higher level
- study mode (full-time or part-time study)

It is expected that the scholarship will be taken up for T3 2020 and will be subject to eligibility assessment, approval of the prospective supervisor, Centre Director, and the HDR office.
