# 2021 WIP RESEARCH NOTE GUIDELINES

If you wish to get your Work In Progress WIP research paper to be reviewed by experts through the ANZAM Doctoral Workshop, kindly adhere to the following guidelines or your submission might get rejected.

- Submit tour note in a pdf file format.
- Follow APA 7<sup>th</sup> edition referencing style.
- Stick to 3-5 pages in length excluding references.
- Submit before Monday 4<sup>th</sup> October 2021 11:59 pm AWST.

Your Research Note will be discussed by an expert and some other students who might be interested to join the virtual room or allocated to the same expert for their review and therefore, you'll be allocated to a virtual group headed by an expert reviewer and your research note will be shared with the other students of that group for the wider benefit of the group members. Final details will be decided close to the event's day.

Your Research Note should explain your research in a clear and succinct manner. The following guidelines may help you to structure your Research Note. In subsequent pages, you'll also find a pre-formatted template which you should use for your submission. Please retain the formatting and stay within page limits.

Title	Include the working title of your thesis / dissertation / research
Keywords	Include at least four (4) keywords to describe your research. This will assist us in matching you with a relevant session / expert reviewer. Ensure at least one keyword is your research method.
Introduction	Outline the phenomenon that you are investigating and state why it is important; capture the reader's interest.
Research Question(s)	Clearly state your research question(s)
Theory Development	Briefly review the 2-3 main constructs underpinning your research and explain how your new theory or approach fits into the current literature
Method	Summarise how you intend to explore or are exploring this phenomenon.
Results/ Discussion	Report your (initial) findings here if you have already completed some data collection and analysis. Omit this section if not yet ready.
