"Spill the Beans" Podcast Series

Dr Hafsa Ahmed, Lincoln University, NZ

 ANZAM Podcast series – Spill the beans was initiated by Dr Hafsa Ahmed of Lincoln University, New Zealand. Each podcast episode is between 15-20 minutes and is hosted on ANZAM's website and YouTube channel. Over a number of months, Hafsa has spoken to various members of the ANZAM
 community and explored different topics of interest, which have received over 1160 views. The discussion topics have varied from talking about ANZAM's role with Professor Melanie Bryant to leadership with Professor Kevin Lowe

and discussing entrepreneurship with Professor Rowena Barrett. With Professor Helena Cooper Thomas she discussed her research around organisational engagement, stress and bullying, while with Dr Marissa Edwards it was exploring the topic of mental health in academia. She also spoke with senior ANZAM members Professor Neal Ashkanasy, Professor Kate Kearins and Professor Brad Jackson, who offered career advice for academics. The podcasts started in October 2020 and completed recording of twelve
