# Generating impactful research through problematization Strategies, techniques and illustrations

#### Presenter

Jörgen Sandberg is Emeritus Professor in the University of Queensland (UQ) Business School, Australia, Honorary Professor at Warwick Business School, UK, and at Macquarie University, and Cofounder of the international conference *Philosophy and Organization Studies* (PHILOS). He has researched extensively in the areas of competence and learning in organizations; practice, process, sensemaking theory; theory development; philosophy of science; and research methodology, published in journals such as Academy of Management Journal, Academy of Management Review, Journal of International Business Studies, Journal of Organization Behavior, Organization Theory, Organization Research Methods, Journal of Management Studies, and Harvard Business Review. His most recent books include Generating research questions. Doing interesting research, 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition (with Alvesson, Sage, 2024); Re-imagining the research process: conventional and alternative metaphors (with Alvesson, Sage, 2021) and Skillful performance: Enacting capabilities, knowledge, competence and expertise in organizations (with Rouleau, Langley and Tsoukas, Oxford University Press, 2017). He also serves on the editorial boards for Academy of Management Review, Journal of Organizational Behavior, and Organization Studies.

Aim and background

Key for social scientists is to have something to say not only to academics but also to a broader audience, such as students, practitioners, and educated public. This requires an understanding of how to generate knowledge that are experienced as interesting and relevant in terms of new ideas and other forms of intellectual insights. However, most contemporary research tends to adhere to standardized methods and formulas, leading mainly to marginal contributions instead of more influential and ground-breaking research.

The aim of this workshop is to discuss and exemplify how academics can generate more interesting and impactful research through problematization. In other words, to be able to have something to say both academically and practically. The workshop consists of one 'seminar' and one 'practice' component: The seminar component will provide an overview of the (sad) state of management studies and outline a problematization methodology for generating more impactful research. In the practice component participants will apply the problematization methodology on actual research texts, as a way to generate more interesting and impactful research.

## When preparation meets opportunity: are you ready to pitch your research?

Presenter: A/Prof Flavio Macau, Edith Cowan University

Associate Professor Flavio Macau is the Associate Dean Business Systems and Operations at the School of Business and Law, Edith Cowan University. He is a Operations at the Scholor of business and Eaw, Euth Cowari Oniversity. He is a researcher and lecturer in supply chain management and global logistics. In the past 10 years, Flavio supervised 20+ research projects; lectured 70+ units to 2,500+ students; published one book, three case studies, and 10+ international peer-review articles; assisted 120+ short-term consulting projects. Flavio has a strong media presence on TV (ABC News, TRT World Now), radio (The Money, BBC), newspapers (The Guardian, The Washington Post), magazines (The Choice, MHD Logistics), and news publishers (The Conversation), reaching a combined audience of over 2.5 billion people on more than 60 countries discussing global logistics and supply chain people on more than 60 countries discussing global logistics and supply chain management. He was invited by the US Government to chair a panel at the 2022 Supply Chain Ministerial Forum, a global event with ministers from over 25 countries. Flavio has industry experience in the automotive, agroindustry, and resources sector, working with companies like Mercedes-Benz, BIOSEV, Anglo American, and NEXA Resources. He is a panellist and keynote speaker at industry events (CeMAT), conferences (ANZAM), and contribute to industry associations (WA Freight Reference Group).

A good pitch is an essential skill for academics, enabling them to communicate their ideas and research findings to a diverse audience, ranging from peers to potential funders. Achieving societal impact has a limited effect on your career if you can't promote it properly. This webinar will go through the strategies and tools necessary to distill complex research into compelling narratives, highlighting pitfalls and how to avoid them. Highlighting the significance of connecting with your audience, gain insights on how to render your research more approachable, convincing, and influential.

Building on research in the classroom: Developing your impact as a management educator through scholarly journal publication.

Understanding the distinctive focus of the main management education journals is vital in enabling potential authors decide the most appropriate outlet for their manuscript. Journals in this field are characterised by different methodological, philosophical, theoretical and practical orientations and traditions. Authors are therefore more likely to find success with publishing their work if they understand the background of each journal and how they might engage with previously published work. Understanding also entails appreciation of the topics and areas where journal editors, reviewers and readers have an interest in seeing further research develop, and how work in these traditions is shaped for successful publication.

This workshop will help scholars to position their work thoughtfully in the overlapping spaces occupied by the different management learning and education journals, through highlighting key success (and failure!) criteria, and helping participants learn from successfully published examplar papers.
